## Present Perfect Continuous Tense

**+** S +  + been + V-ing  
They have been learning English for 2 years.

**-** S + have/has + not + been +   
They have not been learning English for 2 years.

**?**  + S + been + V-ing  
Have they been learning English for 2 years?

Usage

Example

Usage	Example
Express long actions that started in the past and continue until now	I've been living in Ireland for almost 4 years.
Express recent actions that have clear evidence or results now	Her eyes are red because she's been crying all evening.
Typically used for shorter, more temporary situations	Have they been learning English this week?

We use it to emphasize **duration or repetition**, the amount of time that an action has been taking place.

**Time Expressions:** lately, recently, for, since, how long, all day / morning / week

Sadie has been learning Chinese for three months.

How long have you been standing there?

We don't usually use stative verbs in the continuous form.

I have known Jessica since high school.
