THE GRAMMAR YOU NEED

What's the difference?

I'm cutting my hair.



I'm **having**
my hair cut.



We use **the causative** when we talk about someone doing something for us.

I'm **having**
my hair cut.



We make a causative sentence
with **have** + **object** + **past
participle**.

I'm **having** **my car** **repaired**.



We can also use **get** + **object** + **past participle**.

I'm **getting** **my nails done**.
